

Activities

Make Your Own Holi Powder

Abeer, or gulal, is the colored powders used for Holi and other Hindu rituals. Make your own colored powder with some simple ingredients.

- 1. Whisk water into 1 cup of white flour until it becomes a paste.
- 2. Mix in food coloring to create the colors you want.
- 3. Roll the paste into a ball, and flatten it to about $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick.
- 4. Let dry 24 hours.
- 5. Grind the flour patties into a fine, colored powder.
