

Activities

Reading Strategies

Focus on: determining meaning using picture and word clues

- Ask students to guess the meaning of each Spanish word and to identify the clues that helped them.
 - * A glossary is provided in the back of the book.

Focus on: text-to-self connections

Model the connections you make to yourself when reading aloud to kids. Ask students to share theirs. In what ways do students relate to the text?


Calavera Abecedario A Day of the Dead Alphabet Book

Learn more about this famous Mexican folk artist, and use our biography organizer to record facts and information about his life and accomplishments.


